US Patent and Trademark Office Hosts Proud Innovation Events

The United States Patent and Trademark Office (USPTO) hosted a series of Proud Innovation events in June to highlight the accomplishments of LGBTQIA+ innovators, entrepreneurs, and small business owners. On June 15, a panel of LGBTQIA+ engineers and business leaders spoke about their experiences moving ideas to innovation. They shared their thoughts on effective leadership and the positive role that team diversity and recognition of diversity can play in strengthening the output of an innovative workplace. On June 22, a panel of LGBTQIA+ business owners spoke about their experiences founding and leading companies that profited from their diverse perspectives. The panels were hosted online and were open to all to attend.

The June 15 panel included two people formerly recognized by Out to Innovate with LGBTQ+ Engineer of the Year awards: David Taubenheim with NVIDIA and Dr. Arianna T. Morales with the General Motors R&D Center.

Monkeypox Research Priorities

In response to the monkeypox outbreak in the U.S. and around the world, the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy has led an effort to set priorities and make funding available for a group of research priorities that can help address the outbreak. In the U.S., monkeypox is disproportionately impacting the LGBTQ+ community and spreading among men who have sex with men. The research priorities account for this disproportionate impact and call for improved communication with these communities and equitable distribution of vaccines and therapeutics.

JustSpace Alliance Releases Videos on Queer Experiences in Astronomy and a Documentary on James Webb Space Telescope Naming Controversy

The JustSpace Alliance has released a documentary on the controversy around the naming of NASA's flagship space telescope, which has been named after James Webb. The producers of the documentary provide this summary description:

NASA's newest space observatory, the James Webb Space Telescope, recently settled into its final orbit, nearly a million miles away. But controversy over the telescope's namesake, former NASA Administrator James E. Webb, is still roiling here on Earth. Webb worked at the highest levels of NASA and the U.S. State Department during the notorious Lavender Scare of the 1950s and 60s, when thousands of federal employees were fired for being gay.

What was Webb's role in the Lavender Scare? How should this legacy affect the naming of NASA's flagship telescope? And what are the implications for LGBTQIA+ astronomers and space scientists in the field today?


